After all the candidates have been presented, the bishop says:

These persons are by God's grace to be commissioned, recognized or ordained to ministry in the holy church of Christ. Bishop R. Lawson Bryan

Those authorized by the Church to inquire about them have discerned that they are persons of sound learning and of Christian character, and possess the necessary signs of God's grace, and have demonstrated a profound commitment to serve Jesus Christ. Therefore, we believe them to be duly called to serve God. We ask you, people of God, to declare your assent to the commissioning and ordination of these persons.

Do you trust that they are worthy, by God's grace, to be commissioned, ordained or recognized?

We do! Thanks be to God!

Will you uphold them in their ministry?

With God's help, we will!

THE GENERAL EXAMINATION

The bishop continues facing the candidates.

My sisters and brothers in Christ, you have been called to a commissioned or ordained ministry. The church now confirms your calling.

As commissioned or ordained ministers, you are to be coworkers with the laity, bishops, deacons, diaconal ministers, deaconesses, home missioners, commissioned ministers, local pastors and elders.

Remember that you are called to serve rather than to be served, to proclaim the faith of the church and no other, to look after the concerns of God above all.

So that we may know that you believe yourselves to be called by God and that you profess the Christian faith, we ask you:

Do you believe that God has called you to the life and work of ordained ministry?

I do so believe.

Do you believe in the Triune God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit and confess Jesus Christ as your Lord and Savior?

I do so believe and confess.

Are you persuaded that the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments contain all things necessary for salvation through faith in Jesus Christ and are the unique and authoritative standard for the church's faith and life?

I am so persuaded, by God's grace.

Will you be faithful in prayer, in the study of the Holy Scriptures, and with the help of the Holy Spirit continually rekindle the gift of God that is in you?

I will, with the help of God.

Will you do your best to pattern your life in accordance with the teachings of Christ?

I will, with the help of God.

Will you, in the exercise of your ministry, lead the people of God to faith in Jesus Christ, to participate in the life and work of the community, and to seek peace, justice, and freedom for all people?

I will, with the help of God.

Will you be loyal to The United Methodist Church, accepting its order, liturgy, doctrine, and discipline, defending it against all doctrines contrary to God's Holy Word, and committing yourself to be accountable with those serving with you, and to the bishop and those who are appointed to supervise your ministry?

I will, with the help of God.

The bishop addresses the candidates:

May God,

who has given you the will to do these things, give you grace to perform them, that the work begun in you may be brought to perfection.

The congregation audibly affirms the action, saying,

Amen.

The bishop, presenters, and candidates are seated.

THE EXAMINATION OF PERSONS BEING COMMISSIONED

The candidates for commissioning come.
The bishop says to the congregation:

By affirming the covenant of baptism,
all members of the holy church of Christ pledge
to serve as representatives of Christ in the world.
Christ gave all of us this command:
"Ask the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into his harvest."

We have asked, and the Lord has answered.

These sisters and brothers know our Savior's concern for God's people, see the plentiful harvest, and are ready to respond generously to the Lord in the words of the prophet: "Here I am; send me."

Urged on by the love of Christ and strengthened by the Holy Spirit, they now come to declare in public their desire to live out the covenant made at their baptism by binding themselves to the service of God under the supervision of the bishop and the guidance of ordained colleagues and by being appointed to share as servant leaders in the body of Christ.

Today we commission them to service as they continue to prepare for ordained ministry among us.

THE PRAYER OF COMMISSIONING WITH LAYING ON OF HANDS

The candidates kneel.

The bishop, extending arms over all of the candidates, prays:

God of the apostles and prophets, of the martyrs and teachers, you raise up men and women to be apostolic leaders in your church. By your Holy Spirit help these, your servants, to understand and live the mystery of your love with boldness and joy.

Deepen their sense of purpose as they exercise commissioned ministry.

Empower them, and those who will walk with them to guide their ministry, together with all of your people, to heal the sick, love the outcast, resist evil, preach the Word, and give themselves freely for your name's sake.

Family and friends may stand in support of each candidate as he or she comes in turn to center kneeler.

The bishop will place hands on their shoulders and pray:

Pour out your Holy Spirit upon *Name*.

Send *him/her* now to proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ, to announce the reign of God, and to equip the church for ministry, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

All audibly affirm the action, saying,

Amen.

As the hymn begins, the bishop, assisted by the conference secretary, the chair of the order of Deacons, and the chair of the order of Elders greet the newly commissioned clergy.

Once greeted, the candidates return to their seats.

LAYING ON OF HANDS AND PRAYER FOR ELDERS

The candidates kneel.

The people pray for them in silence.

The bishop, with hands extended over those being ordained, prays:

We praise you, eternal God, because you have called us to be a priestly people, offering to you acceptable worship through Jesus Christ, our Lord, Apostle and High Priest, Shepherd and Bishop of our souls.

We thank you that, by dying, Christ has overcome death and, having ascended into heaven, has poured forth gifts abundantly on your people, making some apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, to build up the body of Christ, and to fulfill your gracious purpose in the world.

Give to these your servants the grace and power they need to serve you in this ministry.

Make them faithful pastors, patient teachers, and wise counselors.

Enable them to serve without reproach, to proclaim the gospel of salvation, to administer the sacraments of the new covenant, and to offer with all your people spiritual sacrifices acceptable to you; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

Family members and friends may stand where they are to pray for each ordinand as he or she comes in turn to center kneeler with sponsor.

The bishop will place hands on his or her head and pray:

Almighty God, pour upon *Name* the Holy Spirit, for the office and work of an elder in the holy church of Christ.

All audibly affirm the action, saying,

Amen.

Immediately the candidate places hands on a Bible as he says:

Name, take authority as an elder to preach the Word of God, to administer the Holy Sacraments, and to order the life of the Church in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Amen.

The Orders of Ministry in The United Methodist Church

Candidates for ordination certified prior to January 1, 1997, were ordained deacon and admitted into probationary membership in the annual conference. A minimum of two years later this deacon may have been ordained elder and admitted into full membership in the annual conference. The 1996 General Conference eliminated the "two-step" process of ordination. A candidate for ministry is now commissioned for service and is then ordained after a minimum period of three years.

The commissioned candidate may be ordained as an Elder or Deacon.

Elder - ordained to word and service, sacrament and order, and becomes an itinerating member of the annual conference.

Deacon - ordained to word and service and becomes a non-itinerating member of the annual conference.

The Ministry of a Deacon – From the earliest days of the church, deacons were called and set apart for the ministry of love, justice, and service; of connecting the church with the most needy, neglected, and marginalized among the children of God. Deacons are called by God, from among the baptized, to a lifetime of servant leadership, authorized by the Church, and ordained by a bishop. Deacons give leadership in the Church's life in the teaching and proclamation of the Word; in worship, and in assisting the elders in the administration of the sacraments of baptism and the Lord's Supper; in forming and nurturing disciples; in conducting marriages and burying the dead; in the congregation's mission to the world; and in leading the congregation in interpreting the needs, concerns, and hopes of the world. It is the deacons, in both person and function, whose distinctive ministry is to embody, articulate, and lead the whole people of God in its servant ministry.

The Ministry of an Elder – Elders are ordained ministers who, by God's grace, have completed their formal preparation and have been commissioned and have served as a probationary member, have been found by the Church to be of sound learning, of Christian character, possessing the necessary gifts and evidence of God's grace, and whose call by God to ordination has been confirmed by the Church. Elders are ordained to a lifetime ministry of Service, Word, Sacrament, and Order. They are authorized to preach and teach the Word of God, to administer the sacraments of baptism and Holy Communion, and to order the life of the Church for mission and ministry. The servant leadership of the elder is expressed by leading the people of God in worship and prayer, by leading persons to faith in Jesus Christ, by exercising pastoral supervision in the congregation, and by leading the Church in obedience to mission in the world.

Instruments and Sign Acts for the Ordering of Ministry

Ordinations and consecrations ritualize the distinctiveness of the different orders. Thus, not only what is said but what is done and the signs and instruments employed are significant. Following are the distinguishing signs and instruments:

For Deacon (Probationary and Full Connection) Stole – over the left shoulder and fastened under the right arm Instrument – towel, pitcher, and basin

For Elder

Stole – yoked at the back of the neck, hanging straight down from the shoulders Instrument – chalice and paten

For Bishop

Elder's stole – to be worn from the beginning of the service Instrument – crozier (pastoral or shepherd's staff)

The Bible is an instrument common to all the orders of Christ's ministry.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.


It is right to give our thanks and praise.

CHARGE TO THE LAITY

Dearly beloved, God calls all Christians to minister wherever Christ would have them serve and witness. Your ministry in Christ's name and spirit is both a gift and a task. You have been baptized into Christ and set apart by God's Spirit for this ministry. Will you do all in your power, by the grace of God, to convince the world of the reality of the gospel? Will you support all who have been appointed to lead and represent you and the church of Jesus Christ in its ministry, by prayer, work, gift, and deed?

We rejoice to recognize you as persons called to lead and represent the church. We thank God for calling you to your ministries, for your lives and your talents dedicated to such service. Remembering all that God has done for us, we, too, accept our mission as members of the body of Christ. Participating with you in Christ's ministry, we will pray for you as you pray for us. We will be generous in our support. We will be good stewards of all gifts. Together we will reach out to the world, ministering wherever Christ leads, witnessing in deeds and words that heal and free.

CHARGE TO ALL WHO ARE APPOINTED TO APOSTOLIC MINISTRIES (These persons shall stand.)

Dearly beloved, you have responded to God's call by offering yourselves in servant leadership. The church of Jesus Christ has affirmed your gifts, the evidence of God's grace in your lives, the promise of your future usefulness to the church and to the world. Some of you are on your journey to become Deacons and Elders in Full Connection. Some of you are Local Pastors, licensed to perform all of the duties of a pastor in the charge to which you are appointed. Others of you are Diaconal Ministers, called to ministries of Service, Justice, and Love within local congregations and the wider world.

Still others of you are Deacons in Full Connection, set apart for a lifetime ministry of Word and Service to both the community and to the congregation in a ministry that connects the two. Some of you are Elders in Full Connection, set apart for a lifetime ministry of Service, Word, Sacrament, and Order. And others of you have been appointed to the Superintendency, carrying the primary responsibility for ordering the life of the Church. Will you be faithful in your work?
